The informal displaying of the collection allows visitors to examine at close range the various graphic techniques of different artists.

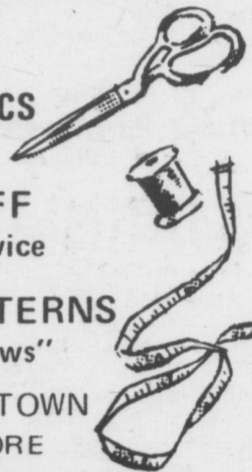

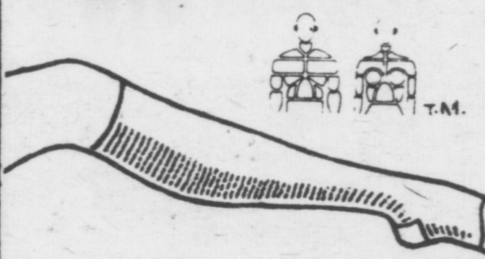
