Hunters are permitted to apply to only one of the two vania Game Commission, areas this year. If a person applies to both areas, that

person will not be eligible to hunt on either area.

Applications must be submitted either to the Pennsylvania Game Commission, Pymatuning Waterfowl Area, R. D. 1, Hartstown, Pa. 16131, or to the Pennsyl-Middle Creek Wildlife Management Area, R. D. 1,

Newmanstown, Pa. 17073.

The applicant's 1975-76 hunting license number, including the letter, must be listed on the application. Applications must be postmarked no later than September 20; if the postmark is later than September 20 the application will be rejected.
