Township discusses fire co. fund

Mount Joy Township Supervisors will discuss setting up a permanent fire protection fund at their next meeting.

At a Friday night meeting, a township solicitor, Henry Gingrich, suggested a fund to aid the various volunteer fire companies which serve the township instead of having the companies come before the

supervisors every year requesting financial aid.

The supervisors decided on the basis of a public survey - not to aid a recreation program in the section of the township that is part of the Elizabethtown School District.

A one-year federally funded recreation program is now under way in the school district and the municipali-

ties affected were asked for funds to continue the program next year.

The survey showed 18 residents against and only 9 for the recreation funding.

John Heisey, Mount Joy R2 farmer, was appointed to the township planning commission to fill the unexpired term of the late Paul Stauffer. The term expires at the end of 1978.
