Fri. deadline for insurance

John M. Clark, executive director, State Bureau of Employment Security, today reminded all persons whose employment was affected by the recent flood, that the deadline for filing a claim for unemployment insurance under Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA) is Friday, October 31.

Clark said unemployed people, not generally eligible for unemployment insurance, could receive payments under DUA, including, among others, farmers and farm workers, and self employed persons.

Weekly DUA payments range from \$75 to \$111 for those who qualify.

Claims may be filed at any Job Service office of the State Employment Service.
