Walters was born in Mount Joy, November 30, 1890.

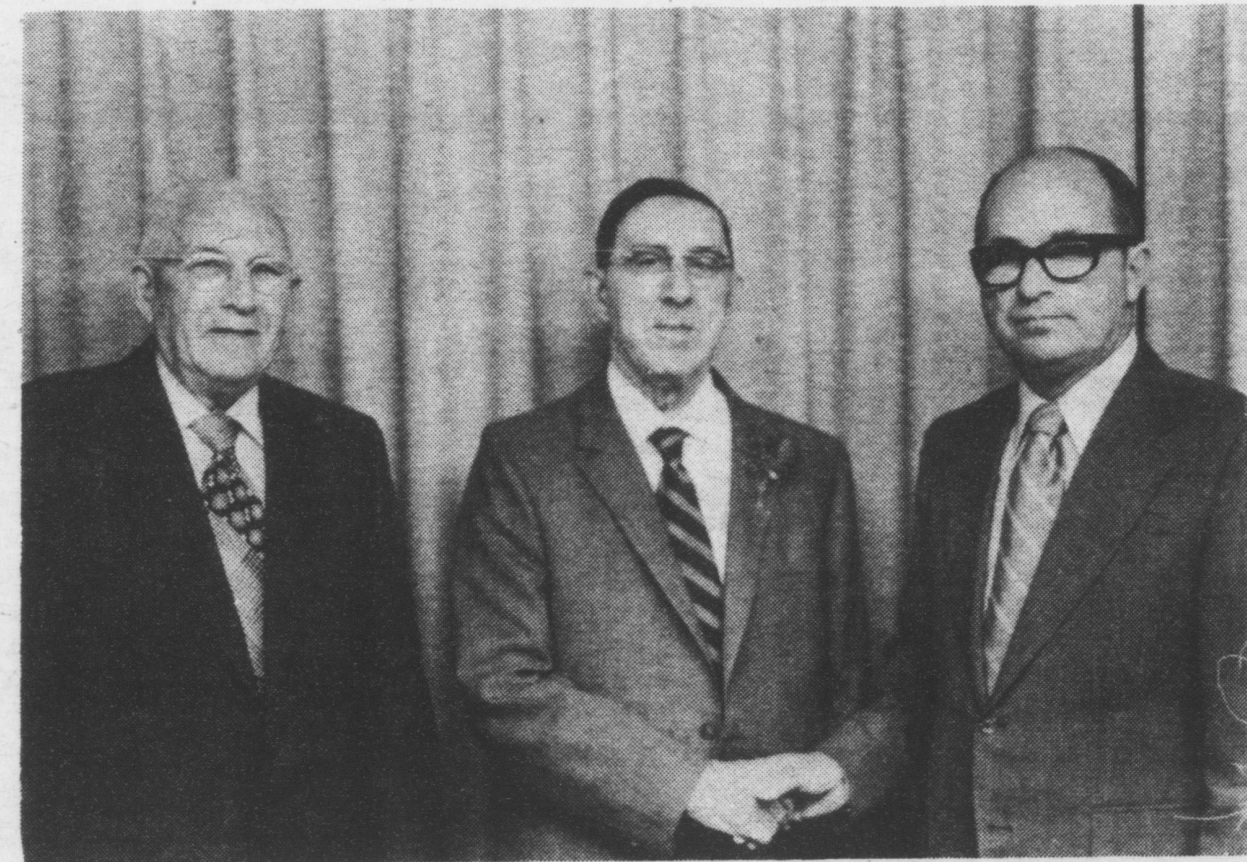
At age 18 he went to work for Clarence Schock's Lumber and Coal Company, working his way up to manager. He was with the Schock Company 31 years.
