The Rev. Walter Frank, General Director of the Greater Europe Mission since his appointment in 1960, will be speaking at the Congregational Bible Church, Rt. 441, Marietta, on Sunday, November 30, at 7 p.m.

Mr. Frank has served as a member of the GEM Board of Trustees since his return from Europe in 1954, where he was involved in evangelism as a field representative for Youth for Christ International in Germany. He also served on the board of the Africa Inland Mission for ten years.

For eighteen years. Mr. Frank pastored three churches in Pennsylvania. His last pastorate was at the Bethel Bible Fellowship Church in Allentown, where he conducted one of the largest annual church missionary conferences in the East.

The Greater Europe Mission sponsors ten Bible institutes in Europe. Other ministries include evangelism, church-planting, conferences, camps, literature. and radio. Currently there are more than 180 GEM missionaries serving in 12 European countries.

Mr. Frank serves in the U.S.headquarters of the mission in Wheaton, Ill.
