ter New Era staff writer Ernest Schreiber. Schreiber was interviewing Heilman about Heilman's plans to leave Lancaster County after living here for 27 years.

Heilman is leaving Lancaster County because of its urban development and smog, both of which have

ruined the scenery he used to photograph.

He is moving to Colorado, where nature is still dominant and the air is clean.

He warned against inviting more industry into Lancaster County which will lead to even more population and crowding.

The area around Maytown which Heilman described as perfectly beautiful, was recently designated as agricultural area in East Donegal Townships new zoning ordinance.

The major purpose of the ordinance is to preserve the area between Mount Joy and Marietta as agricultural land and keep out commercial, industrial, and housing development.


