DONEGAL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH
The historic Donegal Presbyterian Church is the site for District V competition in the Bicentennial Youth Debates, college division, according to Dr. Jobie E. Riley, director of forensics at Elizabethtown College.
The contest, which involves students from Elizabethtown, Millersville State, Franklin & Marshall, and Lancaster Bible colleges, will be held today, Wednesday, December 10, with final competition beginning at 6:30 p.m.
Included will be Lincoln-Douglas debate, persuasive speaking, and extemporaneous speaking, all on topics of current and historic interest, Dr. Riley said. The event is open to the public without charge.
Students participating are competing for U.S. savings bonds, a special medal struck from the occasion by the U.S. Department of Treasury, and the right to advance to the sectional contest at York County Historical Society on Feb. 20-21, 1976.
Judges have been recruited from Elizabethtown and Lancaster, and the savings bonds have been donated by various civic organizations.
