U NDER an act of Congress approved March 3, 1873, widows of officers who were killed, or died of disease contracted in the service, are no entitled to \$2.00 per month for each of their chil-

dren.

The guardian of a minor child of a soldier who

Soldiers who receive invalid pensions can now have their pensions increased to any sum or rate between \$8, and \$18. per month.

Fathers and mythers who lost sons in the service upon whom .aey were dependent for support, can also obtain pensions.
