

Terrible Gallows Scene.

HARRISONBURG, Va., Sept. 25. — Anderson Shifflet, who with Silas Morris was condemned to be hung for the murder of David G. Lawson, was executed in the jail yard here to-day.

The rope used was less than half an inch in thickness and thought to be too weak by many which proved to be true. There was much delay in getting ready to spring the fatal trap, and as the rope holding the trap door was cut, the doomed man fell downward to the ground, the rope being broken.

Singular Suicide.

A strange suicide having a singular incident connected therewith recently took place at Niagara. Dr. Stein, whose health appeared feeble, and who was no doubt suffering under aberration of the mind, arose quite early Friday morning a week and engaged a bootblack to show him around and point out objects of interest.

Dr. Stein asked if there was any carriage to be seen upon the bridge in either direction. The boy looked and answered no. "Is there any one in sight at either part of the bridge?" inquired the old gentleman.

"There is no one at all," answered the boy, after a sharp look. At the same instant Dr. Stein seized the boy and endeavored to throw him over the railing of the bridge. The lad screamed and struggled with all the energy he possessed, and by clinging to the timbers defeated the object of his insane companion.

The attendants of the bridge at each of the shore ends rushed out and made for the rescue. This Dr. Stein perceived, let go of his well-nigh exhausted victim, climbed to the top of the railing, and without a word, sprang into the misty air and the unfathomable pool deep down below.

Heavy Bank Robbery at Cortland.

CORTLAND, N. Y., Sept. 24.—A package containing government and railroad bonds, certificates of stock, mortgages, and promissory notes, estimated at two hundred thousand dollars in value, was stolen from the First National Bank here on Saturday last.

Three Valuable Trunks Missing.

BOSTON, September 25. — Three trunks, containing in the aggregate \$10,000 worth of securities, deposited in the safe of the Cambridgeport national bank, have mysteriously disappeared since the 15th inst., and there is not the slightest clue to the thieves. The trunks and their contents are owned by Luther Slater, Oliver J. Rand and S. B. Snow, the latter the cashier of the bank.

Killed in a Drunken Row.

MILFORD, Mass., September 25. — On Sunday afternoon, in Hopkin, a man named Faley was stabbed in a drunken quarrel by one M'Guire. Faley died three hours after. The murderer decamped, closely followed by officers, who overtook him in Upton, where he had taken refuge in a barn. Upon its becoming dark he eluded the officers, but it is expected that he will soon be captured.

A curious accident happened near New Castle, Del., a few days since. A young girl, about eleven years old, was found lying flat on the ground dead, with her face buried in a crock of water. She had been sent for milk and it is supposed that she stumbled and fell, her head striking the crock with such force that the blow rendered her powerless, and that her face being buried in the water, she was drowned.
