THE GREAT LIMESTONE BELT OF KANSAS.

The Attractive Region of the West.

The "Great Central Plains," are a geographical feature of the State of Kansas. Covered with a remarkably nutritious vegetation, for centuries they were an immense pasturage for countless herds of buffalo, antelope and other ruminating animals whose habitat was the far stretching green prairies that today form one of the most beautiful agricultural portions of the Mississippi Valley.
