In this natio the pilekle can be increns d to any quantity destred. Let these be boiled together until all the dirt from the sugar rises to the top and liskimmed
off. Then throw it thto a tub to coll, and when cold, pour it over your beef or pork. The ment must be well covered
with the piokkie, and should not be put lown for at teast two days anter killing. during whith time it slouldd be silighty spinitiled with saltpetre, which removes
ail the surfice blood, de., leaving the heat fresh and clean. Some omit boil well, thought the operation of boiling purifies the pickle by throwing off the
dir alwnys to be found th saltand sugar. dirt tha mys to be found in salt and sugar.
