Take coals on fire and drown them out, Then on the ground spread them about, Put oats on top, feed once a week, And free from cholera you will keep. The onions heal the sick and sore, And oats and coal forbid it evermore.

tor One ounce of thoroughwort, one ounce flaxseed, simmer together in one quart of water until the strength is entirely extracted; strain carefully, and add one pint of best molasses and half pound loaf sugar; and when cold bottle tight. A few doses of one tenspoonful at a time will alleviate the most distressing cough of the lungs.
