When Wheat should be cut．
There has been some diveraty of opln－ ion an to the best time to cut wheat，
judging from the common practice of judging from the common practice of farmers．It ts generally cut when dead
ripe，or at least when the griln has ripe，or at least when the grain has
become hard．This fy no doubtan error and one of more fimportance than many suppose．It ahould be remembered that wheat is composed of gluten，staroh and bran．Glaten is the nourishing quality of the grain，makes the flour stick
together in the hands of the baker，and together in the hands of the balker，and
gives weight to the grinin－and there in the greatest quantity of gluten in the grain，just when the straw is yellow two or three Joints from the ground，the head turns downward，and you can mash a grain between your thumb and
finger without producling any mill may therefore be set down as an Indis－ putable truth that every day the wheat stands after this stage of ripeness，th gluten decreases in quantity and the bran increnses in thinness，while also makes its appearance duilng the laet ten days of June．
