Educating a Husband.

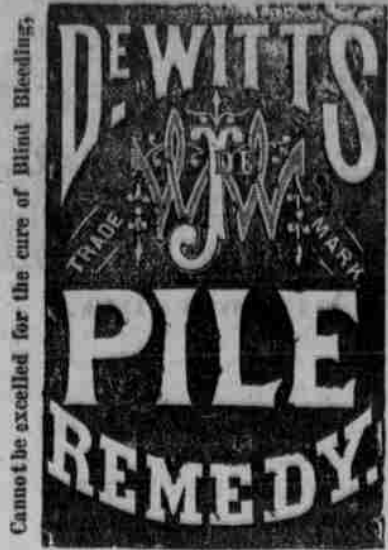
