Judge Bacon of the Superior Court has
just rendored an important decison for just rendered an important deciison for
fravelers in declaring that a corporation, Laving agreed to carry a passerger over a through route at a reduced rato less than
that asked for transport to some intermediate station, bas no right to prevent that passenger from stopping at such intormediate points till ho has paid additional fare. The particular case was that of Ward McAllister, a Harrard law student, who bought a tioket from Boston to New York
by the Old Colony line, and on attempting to go ashore at Newport was detained by an officer of the company till he had pald sixty cents additional. Judge Bacon says the company may demand the difforence in
fare between tho local and the through fare between the local and the through
rate, and, if payment is refused, may rerate, and, if payment is refused, may re-
cover the same in a civil action, but have no other remedy. His Honor also held that a paasenger leaving the boat on this dollar ticket would be a trespasser on the gang plank
