The album, which will be the very first one ever produced, published, manufactured, and distributed in both the eastern and western hemispheres, will be released this spring.

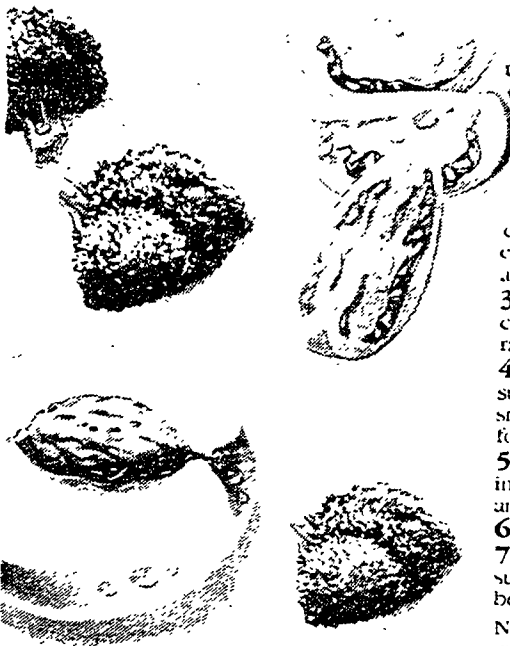

All of the proceeds from the album sales will go to Greenpeace in order to encourage cooperation and stimulate public awareness of the global environmental crises.
