Commercials Aren't Just for Advertising Anymore

Maybe I should become a doctor and put some honesty back into the profession.

Another type advertisement technique I cannot come to grips with is the Herky Jerky Cameraman had a seizure type in which the camera moves seemingly out of control from one speaker to the next. This technique was first developed by the folks at Nissan (Japanese for "In terms of quality, we can wipe your American butts off the map") who don't have much to do besides develop commercials where people sit

These are just a few examples which explicitly detail the high entertainment quality of today's television commercial. Many others exist. From the highly informative ads telling of the importance of oats via Wilford Brimley to the class that exists on its own - using harmless domestic animals to sell beer. I could go on for hours on the ineptitude of major beer companies but I'm afraid I might miss today's Word From Unity.
