# Two false fire alarms reported within past two weeks

Lawrence Hall was evacuated by campus police shortly after I am Sunday following the second false fire alarm in the building in the last two weeks.

Randy Hoffman, Manager of Police and Safety, reported that officers evacuated and inspected the building. No evidence of smoke or fire was discovered. Officers did find evidence of an intentional false alarm, set on the east end of the first floor. Residents were allowed back in the building about 20 minutes after the evacuation. Hoffman said that his department is continuing to investigate and asks that anyone with information contact the Department of Police and Safety at Extension #6101.

Police are currently investigating two cases involving the theft of property belonging to Behrend students. A VCR valued at approximately \$350 was stolen from a campus apartment. The student who reported the theft

stated that he was in his bedroom using the phone when he heard someone enter his apartment. Upon investigation, he discovered his VCR had been stolen. Hoffman stated that the student's apartment had been unlocked at the time of the theft.

Hubcaps valued at \$200 were stolen Friday from a vehicle parked in the apartment lot. According to Hoffman, the vehicle belonged to a male student residing in one of the campus apartments.

Police are seeking information which will lead to the identification of the person or persons who emptied a fire extinguisher inside one of the campus apartments. According to Hoffman, the incident was committed between 8 pm Thursday and I am Friday. He stated that the apartment resident admitted to leaving the apartment unlocked and that the student discovered the crime when he returned. Potential damage estimates from the dry chemical could be as high as \$2000, Hoffman said.

Three bottles found on the floor near a broken window in the Apartment Community Center are believed to have been used to smash the window. The incident was reported to campus police on Saturday, and the investigation continues.

Two minor traffic accidents are under investigation. On Tuesday, January 30, a student reported her car was hit while parked in the Reed Lot. Hoffman stated that the accident happened during the evening and that minor damage to the right rear of the car was reported. The second accident was reported on Friday by a commuter student whose car was damaged while parked in lot E. Minor damages were reported.

Department of Police and Safety monthly statistics for January 1990 show that the department conducted 23 original criminal investigations, 31 follow-up criminal investigations, and issued 311 University tickets. In addition, the department reports that it performed 2,990 building checks and made three arrests.

"If the DA's office says the fraternity will be considered a corporate entity," Zelinski said, referring to Sigma Kappa Nu's incorporated status, "then only the fraternity will face charges. If, however, the DA says they're not a corporation, the fraternity and

it's officers and other individuals may face charges."

He added the supplying alcohol charges are misdemeanors and officials have up to two years to prosecute the case. Zelinski also said the groups may face additional charges, including corruption of minors and

disorderly conduct, depending on the DA's discretion.

While Sigma Kappa Nu may be spared criminal charges at the moment, another wrinkle in the case is university discipline.

According to David Shields, Assistant Dean of Student Services, Sigma Kappa Nu is currently in the last month of a year-long probation. Shields said no decisions have been made referring to discipline until the university has more information on the case.

"I suspect," said Shields, "once we have more facts we will respond in some way with regards to disciplinary action. We need to get more information, but we won't be complacent about the situation."

Shields said in a worst-case scenario the fraternity could suffer a loss of recognition from the university. He added university disciplinary action will depend on how the groups are charged, but said neither Sigma Kappa Nu or Delta Chi wouldn't escape an inquiry into the matter.

Officials were not sure when the District Attorney's office would reach a decision as to whether charges would be filed, and it so, how and when.
