## Some study abroad trips cancelled

(continued from page 1) as other nearby countries. I'm really hopeful I can still go."

The study abroad program at Penn State offers students the opportunity to travel to a different country and experience another culture while taking classes in their field of study. Students must apply at least a year in advance and have obtained a GPA of 2.5 to study abroad.

Mari Trenkle, coordinator of academic affairs and head of the study abroad program here at Behrend, said the program is a good opportunity for students.

"I think joining the study abroad program is a healthy opportunity -- it opens your eyes and allows you to view the world with a more global perspective."

Entering into the program isn't that difficult, but some fields of study or majors are more competitive than others. The final decision is based on GPA when more students apply than there are spots available in the program.

To apply for study abroad programs, the student must write an essay on why he or she wishes to study abroad and how the program fits into their major.

Students must choose a specific country through the programs Penn State makes available. Also, the student must send a transcript of his or her grades and have an authorized signature from their faculty advisor.

There are many countries that students have the opportunity to choose from. Some of the countries chosen by students from Behrend include Germany, Australia, England, Spain, and Egypt.

# Officials clarify draft system College deferments will be limited

For many young men between the ages of 20 and 26, the Gulf war has raised questions concerning the draft.

During the Vietnam war, fulltime college students were allowed deferments from the draft, but current laws are more inclusive.

"Student postponements will be allowed, but only until the end of the semester," said Lew Brodsky, Selective Service System assistant director for

public affairs.

"Seniors will be allowed to earn a degree, but will remain eligible for the draft until they reach age 26," he continued.

Captain James E. McCarthy Jr., professor of military science and Officer in Charge of Behrend's ROTC detachment, said "It would be up to Congress to decide about a draft,"

He also mentioned that the Selective Service System, in a statement January 11, announced that the crisis in the Gulf did not warrant a draft at that time.

During the Sixties, young

men who could afford college were able to avoid the draft, causing a controversy officials have since corrected.

Exemptions for the draft include: conscientious objectors, ordained ministers and students studying the ministry of a recognized church and men with legitimate financial hardship.

Today's Selective Service System, designed for military emergencies, can distribute draft cards within 24 to 72 hours of congressional notice.
