Paulsen's squad had a series of tough breaks, bad bounces, and controversial calls from the officials that cost them the win.

One of their worst nightmares was the Keuka duo of forwards Andrew McNeil and Kyle Bower. Both Bower, a 6'4" junior, and McNeil, a 6'6" sophomore, averaged 13 points against the Lions.

Veteran guard Chris Viscuso said, "We played a really good game, they were just on a hot streak. It could have gone either way." He added, "We executed well, but the ball just wasn't going in."
Viscuso led team scoring against the Warriors with 14 points. Byron Thorne and Rich Buzalka each had 12 buckets on the night.
Senior point guard Randy Baughman said "We played well on the road against a team that's won 16 (games) in a row." Baughman had a total of 11 points on the game.

The Lions had better luck against Alfred University earlier in the week, when they defeated them 80-76 in a game with enough suspense to make Agatha Christie jealous.
