The Lady Lions volleyball team lost a heartbreaker Tuesday night, 6-15, 15-3, 12-15, 15-9, 12-15 to Fredonia State at Erie Hall.

The Lions played poorly in the first game. They made errors returning serves, they did not pass well, and they could not put the ball away on offense.

The second game was a complete turnaround from the first one. The Lions started strong and took a quick two point lead on Kellie Jordan's serve.

The Lions continued to play tough and took an early 3-0 lead in the third game. Fredonia came back to life, however, and tied the score at 6-6. The game was evenly played until Fredonia took the final four points to win 15-12.

Behrend played well in the fourth game and won 15-9 to even the match score at two games apiece.

In the fifth and final game, Behrend came out with all their guns firing and stormed to a 10-1 lead. Unfortunately, they cooled
