

Greek expansion cap still intact after 7-6 vote

(continued from page 2) system at Behrend (including the cap plan), provides a cap-exception for "a group or groups that present a unique opportunity for involvement not presently being met by our Greek system."

This plan was adopted by Student Government in the fall of 1990 and the cap extensions were approved last week.

There is a possibility that the cap extensions could stretch

considerably beyond the current dates. If this were to happen, says Shields, "I would go back and challenge some of their rationale for the cap, if I felt they were prolonging it for some reason."

Nevertheless, Donelly said that the group was working with the Panhellenic Council in hopes of gaining a seat in the future and, "expanding the options for girls on campus by expanding the number of Greek organizations open to women."

World

TOKYO -- Yoshio Sakurauchi, speaker of Japan's House of Representatives, yesterday retracted remarks he made about American workers earlier this week. In his remarks to the Japanese house Sakurauchi said American workers were illiterate, lazy and "if America doesn't watch out, it is going to be judged as finished by the world." U.S. and Japanese officials are still divided over the trade imbalances, the majority occurring in the auto industry.

UNITED NATIONS --Yesterday the United Nations Security Council adopted an anti-terrorism resolution demanding of Libya to hand over the suspects charged, among other incidents, with the bombing of Pan Am Flight 103. If the vote is ignored sanctions could be brought against Libya. U.S. Ambassador Thomas Pickering said "The resolution makes clear that neither Libya or any other state can seek to hide support for international terrorism behind traditional principles of international law". Libya has not shown any signs of cooperation and it indicated it would not turn the suspects over.

PHILADELPHIA -- Disagreements continue between anti-abortion protestors and abortion rights activists as they argued over whether the U.S. Supreme Court can avoid reconsidering the legality of abortion when reviewing Pennsylvania's abortion law. The high court said it would only settle the matter concerning state law but avoid reexamining its 1973 decision in Roe vs. Wade.

DETROIT -- Detroit's police chief is on trial after allegedly stealing \$2.6 million from a fund which was to be used to pay informants, but instead was used to support the chief's mistresses. William Hart, 67, has also been accused of using \$60,000 of the fund to pay the rent on his daughter's Beverly Hills home. Suspended after being indicted last February, he still collects his \$90,000 salary.

WASHINGTON -- Harris Wofford, who upset one of Pennsylvania's most popular political figures in a dramatic comeback campaign, was sworn into the United States Senate in a brief ceremony Tuesday. Wofford defeated former governor and Attorney General Richard Thornburgh and is the first Democrat to win a Senate seat in 30 years. Wofford, who will be finishing the term of the late Sen. John Heinz, pledged to continue his fight for health care reform.
