## Search for division head...

large degree of administrative talent.

"The candidate would have to have an established record of scholarly research -- papers published, books written -- since the candidate would have to be appointed to full professor in order to become head of the division," said Frankforter. "The candidate would also have to have a degree of humanistic talent as well as administrative talent." Frankforter added he imagined a doctorate degree, or the equivalent for art degree holders, would be required.

The new division head, according to Frankforter,

will have perennial challenges.

"The new head will be doing many difficult things, including recruiting faculty. We are filling five positions at the moment; just one of those positions had 250 applicants," he said. "Another task is working with the current faculty and staff to build their careers and professional dossiers."

Money, or lack of it, is another problem Frankforter's successor will have.

"The new head will have to supervise a number of budgets, many of which haven't grown in the past four or five years," said

Frankforter. Additional issues include the

integration of the diversity requirement and the new writing across the curriculum program, which encourages all students to "write to learn," regardless of their major.

Frankforter, who has served as acting division head for the past two years, said he didn't want the position because his calling is in the classroom.

"I never thought of myself as an administrator. An academic administrator is a special career, something far different from teaching," he said. "I'm looking forward to getting back to teaching and writing."
