## EECCC now handles evening dispatching duties for Behrend

directly to EECCC.

"Only emergency and important calls should be placed on these two lines," said Silvis. "Information inquiries should be directed to the operator line (6000)."

The new services provided by EECCC will answer both emergency and police service calls and has radio contact with the police officer on patrol at all times after normal office hours.

Dispatchers will answer "Behrend Emergency" or "Behrend Police." The caller then has contact with a dispatcher who

will relay information to the on-duty police officer or the necessary fire or ambulance department.

Under the previous system, Alert Communications of Erie answered both emergency (898-6231) and informational (898-6000) calls.

Alert Communications would then review the incoming calls and contact the officer on patrol through radio communication. All police service calls (898-6101) were forwarded to an answering machine in the Police and Safety office to be periodically checked.

Silvis said this "resulted in an extended period of response."

"This should be a fairly easy transition," said Silvis. "So far there have been no complications or complaints since the new system has been in effect."

All general information calls (898-6000) will still be handled by Alert Communications, but they no longer have direct radio contact with police officers.

EECCC is the emergency dispatching center for Brookside Fire Company, Wesleyville and Lawrence Park Police, Wesleyville Hose Co., Behrend Police and Safety and North East's police and fire departments.

## Fuller steps down President of SOC, SADD, TOTH resigns

The president of three organizations on campus resigned last week, claiming the demands of school, work and personal obligations forced him to re-evaluate his priorities.

Steve Fuller, a second semester DUS major, was the president of the Student Organization Council (SOC), Top Of The Hill (TOTH) and Students against Driving Drunk (SADD). Fuller turned in his resignation last Thursday, citing the growing demands of academics, work and personal life

as reasons for his resignation.

"It just became too much," said Fuller. "I've had to juggle three part-time jobs, academics, my personal life and children. I was able to do it last semester, but this semester my personal life took precedence."

Fuller said his decision was in the best interest of SOC, TOTH and SADD, adding he would rather not hinder any of the organizations with his other demands.

"Time is an important factor," he said. "Sometimes we can make everything fit together, and sometimes we can't. My decision ultimately rested on a

major personal matter I'd rather not divulge. I did what I could for the clubs. Now it's time for me to step aside and let people take over who can do even more. However, anyone who steps into any of these positions will be hindered by a lack of involvement."

Theresa Baumgartner will be taking over the president's position for TOTH, while Lori Royer will move into the SOC president's position.

Steve Fuller has served as SOC president for one semester, TOTH president for two semesters and SADD president for two semesters.
