# Behrend loses \$100,000 to Casey's budget axe

Provost Jack Burke.

Behrend's portion of the payback will be over \$100,000. This amount is roughly five percent of what the campus has available to spend, after allocating salary money for the year.

According to Burke, services at Behrend may not be affected at all.

"There is a possibility, but it's not likely that we would cut anything significantly." The June deadline has administrators

searching for areas to extract the funds from.

**"That (\$100,000) doesn't sound like a lot of money, but ... it turns out to be a fairly substantial amount in terms of dollars we can actually spend."**

Behrend, according to Burke, is underfunded compared to the other campuses. This has forced the College to concentrate on financial efficiency. "We may be the recipient of some of the dollars being recycled," explained Burke.

The next few months will be a period of tightening up. There are no plans for cutting back hours, however some future projects may feel the budget knife. "What we'll end up doing, is not doing some of the things we had hoped we'd do," said Burke.
