their division, and was the only team to beat Grove City which has an extraordinary volleyball club.

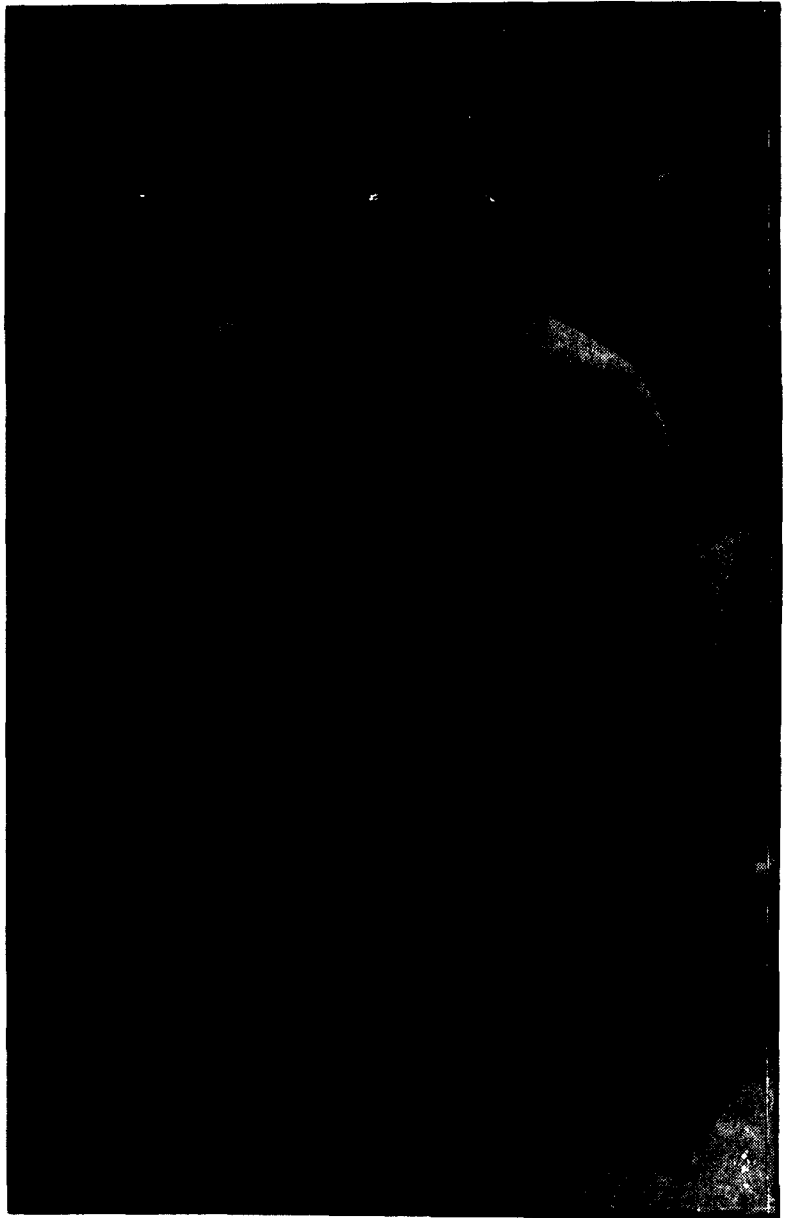

Do you want to be famous? If you are concerned about your alcohol problem, read on.

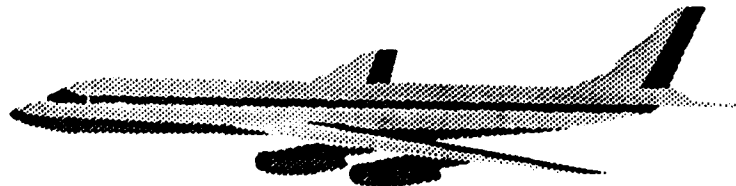
