

NEW COFFEE HOUSE OPEN

The Inn Secure Coffee House, Inc., is an area non-profit organization, legally incorporated and dedicated to providing an intellectual, sophisticated atmosphere for pleasure and conversation.

Temporary headquarters are in the basement of St. Paul Episcopal Church located at 134 West Seventh Street. Programs are each Friday night from 8 to 12 p.m. until such time as arrangements are completed for permanent establishment at Seventh and Peach Streets on the south west corner.

When all arrangements have been completed, the Seventh and Peach Streets location will be open on a day to day basis. During the week it will serve as a "lounge" for students between classes, including a pleasant atmosphere piped in music, coffee, and pastries. In the evening there will be selected programs such as art films, speakers, one act plays, etc. On Friday and Saturday nights professional entertainment will be provided, including: folk music, jazz, dixieland and what have you.

There will be a cover charge on the weekends to pay for the entertainment with a 50% reduction to card bearing members.

Membership will be limited to five hundred persons and membership cards will be sold at three dollars each. Only college students or college age people will be eligible for membership. A membership card entitles the holder to fifty per cent reduction of the cover charge on weekends when there is professional entertainment,

to a subscription to the newsletter sent out weekly and to special programs held during the week. Membership cards will go on sale the day of the opening of the permanent coffee house.

The Inn Secure is sponsored by the Erie Council of Churches.
