THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

THE Board of Trustees of the College held its regular semi-annual meeting at Harrisburg on Thursday, January 26th.

All of the officers of the Board were re-elected for the ensuing year. They are Gen. J. A. Beaver, president; John Hamilton, '71, treasurer, and Dr. Geo. W. Atherton, secretary. The members of the Executive Committee—Messrs. Beaver, Woodward, Gordon, '66, Hiester, '68, and Atherton—and those constituting the Experiment Station Advisory Committee—Messrs. Woodward, Mylin, Herr, Downing, and Atherton—were also re-elected.

The Board decided that in the future all members of the regular foot ball or base ball teams shall not be required to pay the prescribed gymnasium fee.
