by Smith, who got away for his second touchdown. The big tackle made some great runs during the game, while Weaver at the opposite tackie recovered fumbles and punts with surprising quickness. He was always just where needed.

McCleary added two more touchdowns in quick order, while Hollenback was sending out second-varsity players from the sidelines. West Virginia's defense had almost dwindled to nothing by this time and when Barrett went in at "rear halfback," the crippled one tore off fifty yards in two attempts and scored a touchdown. McCleary kicked the goals from his touch downs and Barrett added a point in this way after his score thus bring ing up the total to 40 to 0.

There was almost ten minutes of the second half yet to play but the visitors' substitute-list was exhausted and their humiliation was great enough, so that referee Sinclair called off hostilities on account of 'darkness'

The performance of our men was so good that it was generally conceded that Old State could have beaten almost any eleven in the country last Saturday. Captain Hutchison, Yount, Woodhouse and Bullard worked persistently to hold down the score but in vain. the ball was once given to West Virginia on our 20-yard line after Weaver had recovered a blocked kick, the visitors lost 5 yards in three downs Watson, Gray and Johnson seemed always to be down on punts right with our good ends and there was not a flaw to be found in the work of any man Mauthe punted well and the players substituted in the second halt played up to the varsity standard. Engel and Hermann dis tinguished themselves especially. It was a big day for the coaches and the whole squad above all a redletter day for Old Penn State.
