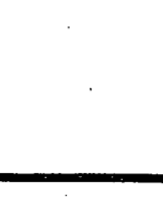

Beer In Fraternity Houses Restricted By Liquor Board

State Enforcement Officers Warn Organizations Against Serving Members Under 21

Fraternities cannot serve beer or hold beer parties unless all members of the house originating the party and those served beer are over 21 years of age. This was the warning given by two members of the enforcement division of the State Liquor Control Board called here to attend a meeting of the Fraternity Co-operative Association Thursday night at the Phi Delta Theta fraternity house. Purpose of the meeting was to consider the legal aspects involved in the proposal by a number of fraternities that they be allowed to serve beer on liquor.

The board officers pointed out that fraternities could not obtain a restaurant license because they served no food to the public, while minor members of the board would be liable for the beer. With regard to beer parties the Liquor Board representatives stated that they would be legal provided that all members of the party are over 21 years of age and that beer would not be sold or served to anyone outside of the original party. They said that beer could not be bought out of fraternity funds.
